

Dear Parents,

We are anticipating another great year at **PowerTime Camp!** PowerTime is a disciple-making ministry of the South Atlantic District of the Christian and Missionary Alliance. **This year's camp will be June 17-22, 2019 at Camp Bob Cooper in Summerton, SC.**

The cost for camp this year is \$290 for all campers **if** registration form and \$100 deposit is postmarked by Monday, May 13. Otherwise, a \$25 late fee will apply. The balance is due by Monday, June 3. ***Please complete your registration form online and get a \$100 deposit to your church Camp Coordinator so he or she can mail it out by May 13th.***

All registration is completed online through our district website -- www.saalliance.org. You'll find the camp page by clicking on "Events" at the top of the page. Check with your church camp coordinator to see whether you should pay online (this must be for the whole amount) or whether you should pay a deposit and then the balance through your church.

Check-in at camp begins at 2:00 pm, Monday June 17th. Camp ends Saturday, June 22nd at 9:00 am. Roommate preference will be granted if possible. However, we are unable to pair together campers attending different camps (age groups). Telephone use is permitted only in case of emergency and a counselor must be present. If you desire for your child to call home to let you know he/she has arrived safely, please send a note for the counselor. In the event of an emergency you may call the camp at (803) 478-2105, or you may contact camp Directors, Paul Titus (336) 414-5900, or Ed Pottorff (770) 893-9009.

Please make sure to provide all medical information requested on the registration form. Should you have any health-related questions, please contact a camp director, or you may e-mail the camp nurse, Debbie Knickerbocker, at knickerbockerdavid@yahoo.com.

If your child has been diagnosed with ADD or ADHD, we require that all medications be sent with him or her so that the week may be more enjoyable for everyone. The camp nurse will dispense ALL medications, unless she determines the child is old enough to keep and take his or her own medication. Please see the second page of the individual registration form for more information.

Primary/Junior campers have the snack bar fee included in their \$290 fee. Middle and Senior campers will need cash for the snack bar. The only other money needed is for the missions offering and paintball/skeet shooting (option for older campers only – see below).

If discipline problems arise it may be necessary for a child's parents to arrange immediate transportation home. These cases are extremely rare, but our goal is to have a fun, safe, and uplifting week of camp. We also want to emphasize that **modest clothing is a must**. This means **NO spaghetti strap shirts, NO shirts showing off the mid-section, no short shorts and NO two-piece swimsuits**. Please see the next page for a detailed list of what to bring and what not to bring. ***If your child wishes to participate in a paintball game, he/she will need to bring an additional \$20. Skeet shooting is \$1 per shot (recommended 10) Also, note that waiver forms for these activities are included with the registration materials and must be signed by a parent or guardian before a camper can participate in this activity.***

Our prayer is for a great week of camp where Jesus Christ is exalted and kids grow in their love for Him. We trust that you will pray for the Lord to pour out His blessing.

What to Bring

Skeet Shooting/Paintball Games only – **waiver form**, long pants and a long sleeve shirt. The cost is \$20, \$1 per shot for skeet. Close toed shoes for the adventure courses / ropes and climbing wall.

What NOT to Bring:

***** Campers found with these items are subject to being sent home, and the proper authorities will be notified as required. Campers will also be sent home for repeated rebellious behavior, for initiating inappropriate sexual contact, for leaving the camp grounds, for going off alone unsupervised, or for other dangerous behavior, at the discretion of the Camp Directors.**

Pranks

We know pranks can seem like a lot of fun. At the same time, they are sometimes intimidating to some campers, and they can be dangerous to both people and property. They almost always detract from the spiritual atmosphere of camp. In addition, pranks can escalate, as people and cabins try to “get back at” one another, leading to more serious situations. *In the past, campers have been told not to return to camp the next year due to participation in dangerous pranks. Please understand that we are serious about protecting the safety of our campers. Thanks for your cooperation in this.*

Roommate Preferences

We will make every effort to accommodate roommate requests. However, please note that in certain cases, large groups of campers from the same church often result in difficult decisions. The typical cabin holds about 12 campers. So if a church sends, say, 10 senior high girls and they all room together, then there will be two girls in the cabin from other churches who may end up feeling very left out. Similarly, if a church sends 14 or 15 senior high girls, then the two or three girls from that church who don't get to room with the others will end up in the same situation. For this reason, we sometimes will split larger groups into 2 or 3 different cabins.

All requests for a change in cabin assignment MUST be approved through the appropriate age-group director. Any campers who attempt to change cabin rosters or move to a different cabin without this approval will forfeit their opportunity to be considered for a change!
